## **Career Interruptions and Special Circumstances**

---

In May 2011, I left my tenure-track position at the University of Manitoba to assume a role as a full-time public servant. Over the next six years, I continued to serve in various capacities in both the public and knowledge sectors, as a senior manager in Executive Council and the Public Service Commission, and an adjunct professor at the University of Alberta, where I taught and published in off-hours. Workload, concerns to abide by conflict of interest guidelines, and the necessity of preserving academic freedom severely limited my ability to conduct primary research or publish between 2011 and 2017. These limitations were lifted once I assumed a full-time faculty position as Associate Professor in July 2017. I took two, three-month parental leaves in 2014 and 2020. I have been primary caregiver for two young children throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.
