Dr. Paul L. Gareau is Michif-French/Métis from the Batoche Homeland in Saskatchewan, and is an associate professor and associate dean (graduate studies) in the Faculty of Native Studies at the University of Alberta, Canada on Treaty Six Territory and in the Homelands of the Métis Nation. His research, publications, and teaching explores the Métis (Indigenous) experiences of religion and spirituality, and the legacy of colonial discourses on Indigenous and ethno-cultural minorities. Grounded in Métis Studies and Indigenous Studies as well as Religious Studies, Gareau's work focuses on theory and methodology around relationality, co-constitutive identity, race and gender, Indigenous onto-epistemologies, land and place, nationhood/ peoplehood, and sovereignty/self-determination.

This partnership development research project is to create space across the Métis Homeland for community-situated and place-based conversations that counter conventional, racialized definitions, and reveal the nuances of Métis spirituality, religion, and relations. These conversations and activities took place Fall 2023 in three historical Métis communities: St. Laurent, Manitoba; Lebret, Saskatchewan; and, St. Albert, Alberta. Each community hosted two-day, land-based gathering culminating in an academic symposium in each of the host universities.
